ISF SPECIAL CONGRESS HOUSTON

12 European Federations present out of 42 National Softball representatives attending the ISF Special Congress in Houston at the end of October supported the one point on the Agenda along with the others and attained a 71% favourable vote for the merger between the International Federations of Baseball and Softball into one World Governing body.

ISF legal counsel Ed Colbert gave a thorough explanation on the charter of the new governing body, which will be called, The International Confederation of Softball and Baseball (ICSB) and along with some important discussions by many of the delegates, the Congress approved the merger.

The ICSB has a lot of work in order to prepare the presentation for the joint Olympic bid before the IOC program commission in only 6 weeks from now.

The bid to the IOC will be supported by the Pro Baseball Organizations in the world including MLB. Representatives of both IBAF and ISF met MLB early October in New York, and last week a specific request letter was sent to MLB which will be discussed by MLB owners on the 16th of November.

The bid for men's baseball and women's softball consists of the competitions that will be played at a single venue. Each tourna-

ment would feature eight teams. Baseball and softball will be two disciplines under the new ICSB.

Softball and baseball will present their bid together with karate, roller sports, squash, sports climbing, wakeboard and wushu for inclusion in 2020 Olympics.

After the presentation of the bids in December this year, the IOC Executive Board will decide in May 2013, if there will be an open spot and which sport they will recommend for inclusion. The final decision will be made in Buenos Aires in September 2013.

The newly formed ICSB will have an interim Board with representatives from both federations which will prepare the already mentioned joint bid to the IOC but also the 1st ICSB Congress where it will outline the plans for the coming years and the election of a permanent Board.

This Congress will most likely take place between May and September 2013.

All National Federations are automatically member of this newly formed IBSC and can decide if they will be a member as a Softball Federation or combined as a Baseball and Softball Federation.

We hope that this merger will be the beginning of a new generation of cooperation between the sports and hopefully give us the opportunity to regain our Olympic dreams.

GREAT BRITAIN: CHROMIES ARE SLOWPITCH CHAMPION

There are a lot of National Championships tournaments each year in British softball!

In Co-ed Slowpitch, with over 300 teams playing in leagues affiliated to the British Softball Federation, national club champions are crowned in five different categories of play.

From the top down, these are known as Premier, Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze. The winner of the Premier Nationals becomes Britain's representative in the next European Slowpitch Cup.

There is also a national championship tournament for All-Star Teams representing the different leagues around the country.

And there are Single-Sex Slowpitch Championships for men's and women's teams, with trophies awarded at Platinum, Gold and Silver levels.

In each case, between six and ten teams contest each national championship level.

Finally, the female and male winners of the Great Britain Fastpitch League are given the title of national champions and are eligible to enter European Cup competitions.

Slowpitch Results: 2012

Despite the number of different Co-ed Slowpitch National Championships, each of which are played over a single weekend, the top-level competition, the Premier Nationals, attracts the most attention each year because it features the top teams in British slowpitch softball.

This year, the tournament was played in Manchester, in Northwest England, and nine teams took part.

The winners, after a rally on the second day that took them from the brink of elimination to the title, were the London Chromies.

The Chromies have won the title four times in the last six years and they finished second in the 2012 European Slowpitch Cup after winning the competition in 2011.

Other winners of Co-ed Slowpitch national titles were spread around the country in 2012.

They were: Platinum Nationals Greensox (Manchester)

Gold Nationals Jets (Bristol)

Silver Nationals Masterbatters (Leeds)

Bronze Nationals Rhythm Royals (Windsor)

In Single-Sex Slowpitch, the winners were: Men's Platinum Nationals Hoggs (Manchester)

Women's Platinum Nationals Hooters (Leeds)

Men's Gold Nationals Teabags (Leeds)

Women's Gold Nationals Minx (Manchester)

Men's Silver Nationals Tripods (Manchester)

Women's Silver Nationals Camel Humps (Manchester)

The winner of the League All-Star National Championships was the Edinburgh Softball League from Scotland.


Fastpitch Results: 2012

The Angels will compete next year in the European Champions Cup for Women, as they have for the past several years. In 2012, the Angels moved up to third in the ECW B Pool.

The men's section was won by Richings Park Softball Club, who hope to play in the Men's Super Cup in 2013.

The final series, played as the best of five, was no contest. Spectrum Prague played errorless softball in recording three straight wins by large margins to take the Extra league gold medal.



NETHERLANDS: SURPRISE IN DUTCH LEAGUE

The Dutch softball-season ended with a surprise new champion.

When the 2012 season started many predicted that reigning champion Oolders Omaco Sparks Haarlem and vice-champion Hotel Ambassador c.c. Terrasvogels were to meet each other again in this years Holland Series to play for the Dutch championship.

Sparks Haarlem and Terrasvogels are the two leading softballteams in the Netherlands and are loaded with players who play or have played for the national team. Initially, it appeared to go that way, as Sparks Haarlem dominated during the regular season, losing only three games to Terrasvogels.

In the meantime, Alcmaria Victrix, which made its comeback in the highest division a year ago, played a good season and quickly became the third best team in the league. In the play-offs, Alcmaria Victrix first eliminated Gryphons, while Terrasvogels handed Sparks Haarlem another loss.

But the Haarlem-team went on to win the series to reach the final. A week later, Alcmaria met Terrasvogels and also eliminated this team by playing two strong games.

Then, the best-of-five Holland Series also went the way of Alcmaria Victrix, as it also eliminated Sparks Haarlem, meaning the team from Alkmaar eliminated both Dutch softball-powerhouses to win its first Dutch championship title in club history.

Almost none had predicted that Alcmaria would win the series, as it was expected that Sparks Haarlem would win in three games with big scores.

But the reality proved to be very different, as the teams were very much up to each other and all four games played ended in an one-run score.
